### Mission

De Paul Treatment Centers works with individuals, families and communities to create freedom from addiction.

De Paul serves the community and those affected by the disease of addiction. Using proven and effective evidence-based treatment strategies, De Paul strives to build healthy and hopeful communities in recovery.

# Philosophy

We view addiction as a complex, chronic, and treatable disease. We believe that all individuals have within them innate health and the capacity to recover. De Paul uses comprehensive, multi-disciplinary, culturally appropriate, and evidence-based practices that address the needs of the whole person, family, and community. We support participation in groups such as the Anonymous Fellowships that provide inspiration and hope. Our goal is to help individuals and families stabilize, reconnect, and heal.

### Continuum of Care

De Paul offers a full continuum of care. From detox to residential, outpatient to group and family therapy, and supportive medical care, an individual can move through each level of care under one roof to gain stability. With comprehensive treatment services, we ensure that patient care is not disrupted by changing providers, counselors, or teachers. This continuity of care allows our patients to build lasting relationships and achieve successful treatment outcomes.

# Quality

De Paul has helped over 40,000 individuals and families to create freedom from addiction, since 1977. 92% of our patients would recommend services at De Paul to others who might need them.

De Paul is nationally accredited through the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).





# Adult Programs

At De Paul, we provide treatment for substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders in a structured, therapeutic environment. We address the needs of the whole person and their support partners, including their family and the community in which they live. Our qualified clinical team works to develop individualized treatment plans for each patient using evidence-based practices and a holistic approach. We help our patients develop the skills they will need to be successful in their recovery.

My counselor helped me to open up about my childhood and why I feel and react to certain triggers. She also helped me talk about my anxiety. With her help I'm gaining confidence and self-esteem.

This year we continued to improve the quality of our care through new programs and research. Most notably, we expanded our program for 3.7R level of care to offer increased medical and psychiatric support for our most vulnerable patients. These patients tend to be frequent utilizers of the emergency department and require a higher level of medical and/or psychiatric services than our general population, in addition to treatment for their substance use disorder. We are the only provider of this level of care in the State of Oregon.

Our Peer Services program reached a new level this year and showed the power of recovery in community. Patients who participated in Peer Services completed treatment at three times the rate of their counterparts. We see great things for this program in the coming year.



# Youth Programs

The primary goal of the Youth Program is to stop addiction early. This unique program provides teens with a supportive environment to learn, heal, and live their lives free of addiction.

The De Paul Youth & Family Center in Northeast Portland provides a welcoming and empowering environment for youth and their families. With comprehensive treatment services for male identifying youth ages 13 to 18, our patients work with the same counselors, teachers, and other providers throughout their treatment stay. This continuity of care allows our patients to build lasting relationships for successful outcomes.

We believe treatment and education go hand in hand for successful recovery with teens. Through our on-site accredited academic program, we work with each youth patient to build the confidence and skills they need to re-engage in learning and catch up in school. On average a youth earns 2 credits while in our care.

Through a grant from CareOregon, our Youth Outreach & Addictions Counselor continued to work directly with students at Benson High School, which is part of the Portland Public School system, providing drug and alcohol assessments, individual counseling, and preventative education services. By providing services on-site, we are meeting teens before they drop out of school and ensuring that those who need us most are able to receive the care they need to build a stable recovery. Families of impacted students, and the students themselves, have preferred the ability to access care directly at school. This program is helping students remain engaged in school and preventing them from falling further behind due to their drug or alcohol use.

### **Peer Services**

The Peer Services program is committed to bridging treatment and everyday life to help our patients to build a stronger foundation for their recovery.

Certified Recovery Mentors provide individualized support to patients depending on their needs. Texting and phone support, sober fun activities and outings, and transportation to meetings and appointments are just a few of the activities and services that our peer mentors provide. These services help patients stay connected in the community while focusing on recovery.

# Family Therapy

Addiction affects all aspects of an individual's life, but especially their relationships with loved ones. At De Paul, we encourage family and support partner involvement. Patients and family members work with De Paul's skilled family therapists to learn about the disease of addiction and how to apply new life skills to support family relationships. Patients may begin family therapy upon entering treatment and often remain engaged for the duration of their stay.

### Mental Health

Many of De Paul's patients are in need of treatment for more than just substance use disorders. Mental health evaluations and treatment are available to support patients with a co-occurring mental health diagnosis. Our staff of qualified mental health professionals are equipped to treat a wide range of mental health conditions. Patients with a mental health diagnosis participate in groups specific to supporting their mental health needs. Medication management for mental health is available for our patients through De Paul's medical team.

# **Medical Services**

At De Paul, we provide a full spectrum of medical services to treat the whole person as they begin their recovery from addiction. Staffed with nurse practitioners and registered nurses, our medical services for patients go beyond mental health and addiction treatment. Patients in our residential programs can access basic medical care on site. We coordinate with each patient's primary care provider both during and after their stay to ensure exceptional medical care.







# **Impact**

With the generous support of our community, De Paul Treatment Centers saves lives every day from the devastating disease of addiction. Our evidence-based treatment programs prepare patients for long-term recovery and success in all aspects of their lives. Because of De Paul, our community is a healthier, stronger, more vibrant place to call home.






