Fora Health, formerly known as De Paul Treatment Centers, is one of Oregon's oldest, largest and most respected nonprofit treatment centers providing treatment for substance use disorders and co-occurring mental health disorders. In our nearly 50-year history, we have helped more than 55,000 individuals change their relationship to drugs and alcohol. Fora Health receives one of the highest levels of accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) and has held this designation since 2001.

Fora Health takes a trauma-informed, evidence-based approach to the treatment of drug and alcohol addiction. We offer a full continuum of care services practiced by expert staff, allowing our patients to easily transition between levels of care. By providing this full continuum of care, Fora Health empowers our staff and patients to develop personalized care plans that meet each person's unique, long-term needs and build the relationships and trust that lead to successful treatment outcomes. This includes access to specialty services proven to improve outcomes such as Mental Health Services and Dual Diagnosis Treatment, medications, family therapy, and peer recovery mentor services.

We are committed to fostering a welcoming and inclusive environment of respect and open communication. We are dedicated to culturally responsive programming and attitude, and to celebrating the strengths that everyone brings to the table. Fora Health works with a network of community partners to tap into a wealth of local resources to support patients and their families throughout their recovery journey and beyond.
